Community invited to hear updates and next steps of north Flint crime and safety project

FLINT, MICH. – Hamilton Community Health Network (HCHN) and Illuminating Community Change (IC2) Project's community partner, the North Flint Reinvestment Corporation (NFRC) will be hosting the next quarterly community-led discussion on economic development. The public, residents, block clubs and neighborhood associations are invited to attend the free North Flint Safety Forum on Monday, July 22 from 5 – 8 p.m. at the North Flint Food Market Event Center (5402 Clio Road, Flint, MI 48504).

IC2 and NFRC will discuss the importance of economic development for revitalized communities in Flint's north end. Updates on efforts surrounding the movement of building north Flint up, including research, strategy and implementation of the grant-funded project will be shared with those in attendance. Residents may also learn about job training programs offered by IC2 partners. Plus, free pizza is provided for those who attend the discussion.

"The primary driver of crime in north Flint is poverty," explains IC2's project manager, Sandra Johnson. "The work we are doing within the community aims to reduce crime. With safer neighborhoods residents can begin to see potential in their communities, leading to economic development. As we continue to get the community involved we're working to cast a wider net on unemployed and underemployed residents to get them into training and education so they can break the cycle of poverty and violence through entrepreneurship."

IC2 partners and community members have sat down and discussed the need for education, career-centered training and jobs for youth and adults over the past year. The NFRC leads the efforts to bring more career services to the city's north end.

HCHN received the Community-Based Crime Reduction Grant from the U.S. Department of Justice Bureau of Justice Assistance in 2017. The grant has created the IC2 safety project bringing many community organizations in north Flint together to stimulate community members to be the change and spread the movement.
